Greetings First Pres members:

I wanted to provide a report on several important initiatives underway at the church. As a church, we are gaining momentum – our strategic planning process is progressing, we've constituted the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC), we're progressing with a plan for our website, and we see church attendance as robust as I can recall in my eight years here in Laurens. I also think our annual giving campaign results are outstanding. We still need to continue to make progress, but we are roughly 30% ahead of where we were this time last year. As I said, we have momentum.

From a strategic planning standpoint, subcommittees have been meeting and drafts have been circulated to the Session for approval. However, please know that we will have ample opportunity to discuss the conclusions as a church and pivot/modify as appropriate. This planning process does not produce a document carved in stone, but rather small and large ideas, as well as broad directions that we want to pursue. To that end, I plan to make a fulsome presentation at the church supper on February 1st. Well in advance of that presentation, you'll receive via email a summary of the surveys, the strategic planning process and the results. And I would encourage you to reach out directly to me via phone or email to discuss any thoughts or ask any questions (both before and after that presentation).

The PNC has met several times and completed a fairly detailed Mission Study and Ministry Discernment Profile, both of which have been approved by the Session. We've submitted those to the Presbytery and are awaiting their approval, which we expect to receive shortly. The Plan would be to commence the search in earnest beginning in January. This will be one of the most important decisions we make in the history of our Church.
